#### AN ORDER ADOPTING THE GUIDELINES UNDER ALERT LEVEL 2 OF THE IATF ALERT LEVEL SYSTEM FOR COVID-19 RESPONSE IN THE PROVINCE OF DAVAO DEL SUR

WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Local Government Code of 1991 provides that local governments units shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare, including the promotion of health and safety of the people;

WHEREAS, on November 11, 2021, President Rodrigo Duterte issued Executive Order No. 151, Series of 2021 mandating the implementation of the Alert Level System of the IATF in all areas of the country;

WHEREAS, on January 12, 2022, the IATF issued Resolution No. 156-C placing the entire Province of Davao del Sur under Alert Level 2;

**WHEREAS**, the continued vigilance, formulation and implementation of local issuances on COVID-19 and other proactive measures are necessary to slow down the surge of cases and limit, if not stop, further spread of COVID-19 variants in the Province of Davao del Sur;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARC DOUGLAS IV C. CAGAS, Governor of the Province of Davao del Sur, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby ORDER the following:

**SECTION 1. GUIDELINES UNDER ALERT LEVEL 2.** The following protocols shall be observed in all LGUs in the province, except in areas thereof that may be subsequently placed under granular lockdown:

- 1. Intrazonal and interzonal movement shall be allowed. However, restrictions on intrazonal and interzonal movements enumerated under Executive Order No. 35, Series of 2021 shall remain effective.
- 2. Cockfighting and operation of cockpits, lottery and betting shops, and other gaming establishments shall <u>not</u> be allowed to operate, or be undertaken in all areas in the province except as may be authorized by the IATF or the Office of the President.
- 3. The following establishments, or activities, shall be allowed to operate, or be undertaken at a maximum of 50% indoor venue capacity for fully vaccinated individuals, and 70% outdoor venue capacity. Provided, that all on-site workers/employees of these establishments, or organizers of activities are fully vaccinated against COVID-19 and Minimum Public Health Standards under Provincial Ordinance No. 20-53, Series of 2020, shall be strictly maintained.
- a. Venues for meetings, incentives, conferences, and exhibitions;
- b. Permitted venues for social events such as parties, wedding receptions, engagement parties, wedding anniversaries, debut and birthday parties, family reunions, and bridal or baby showers;
- c. Visitor or tourist attractions such as galleries, exhibits, parks, plazas, public gardens, scenic viewpoints or overlooks, and the like:
  - d. Amusement parks or theme parks;
- e. Recreational venues such as internet cafes, billiard halls, amusement arcades, bowling alleys, skating rinks, archery halls, swimming pools, and similar venues;
  - f. Cinemas and movie houses;
- g. Limited face-to-face or in-person classes for basic education subject to prior approval of the Office of the President;
- h. Limited face-to-face or in-person classes for higher education and for technical-vocational education and training;
- i. In-person religious gatherings; gatherings for necrological services, wakes, inurnment, and funerals for those who died of causes other than COVID-19 and for the cremains of the COVID-19 deceased;

- j. Licensure or entrance/qualifying examinations administered by their respective government agency, and specialty examinations authorized by the IATF subject to the health and safety guidelines as approved by the IATF;
- k. Dine-in services of food preparation establishments such as kiosks, commissaries, restaurants, and eateries, subject to DTI sector-specific protocols;
- I. Personal care establishments such as barbershops, hair spas, hair salons, and nail spas, and those offering aesthetic/cosmetic services or procedures, make-up services, salons, spas, reflexology, and other similar procedures including home service options, subject to the sector-specific protocols of the DTI;
- m. Fitness studios, gyms, and venues for individual non-contact exercise and sports; Provided that patrons/clients and workers/employees wear face masks at all times and subject to DTI sector-specific protocols;
- n. Film, music, and television production subject to the joint guidelines as may be issued by the DTI, DOLE, and the DOH;
- o. Contact sports approved by the LGU where such games shall be held;
- p. Funfairs/peryas or kid amusement industries such as playgrounds, playroom, and kiddie rides;
- q. Venues with live voice or wind-instrument performers and audiences such as in karaoke bars, clubs, concert halls, and theaters;
- r. Gatherings in residences with individuals not belonging to the same household;
- s. Agencies and instrumentalities of the government shall remain to be fully operational and shall adhere to <u>at least</u> 80% on-site workforce. Those assigned to work off-site shall be subject to alternative work arrangements as approved by the head of agency in accordance with the relevant rules and regulations issued by the Civil Service Commission (CSC). Heads of agencies providing health and emergency frontline services, laboratory and testing services, border control, or other critical services shall operate at a workforce beyond the minimum as may be necessary to deliver their mandates;
  - t. Curfew hours will be from 10 pm to 4 am;

- u. Minimum Public Health Standards under Provincial Ordinance No. 20-53, Series of 2020, on social distancing and wearing of face masks shall be strictly maintained; and,
- v. Scanning of DS-CCTS QR Codes, as per Provincial Ordinance No. 20-60, Series of 2020, shall be strictly observed in all public and private establishments.

# SECTION 2. REGULATIONS FOR UNVACCINATED INDIVIDUALS IN THE PROVINCE. Unvaccinated individuals shall:

- 1. Remain in their residences at all times except for the procurement of essential goods and services such as, but not limited to food, water, medicine, work and medical necessities;
- 2. Be prohibited in indoor and outdoor dining restaurants and other food establishments and shall also be prohibited from entering malls, hotels, event venues, gymnasiums, and similar facilities in accordance with the DTI and IATF guidelines;
- 3. Be prohibited in domestic travel via public transportation except to avail of the goods and services mentioned paragraph 1, subject to the presentation of sufficient proof to support and justify such travel;
- 4. Be required to undergo RT-PCR test once every two (2) weeks at their personal expense and present a negative COVID-19 result prior to being admitted to work. Unvaccinated individuals who reside outside of the province but who work and travel to the province shall also be required to submit a similar negative RT-PCR result;
- SECTION 3. REGULATIONS FOR ESTABLISHMENTS AND PUBLIC TRANSPORT PROVIDERS. All establishments and public transport shall require all clients and passengers to present vaccination cards or, if not available, sufficient proof to support and justify the individuals access to goods and/or services.
- **SECTION 4. IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS ORDER.** The law enforcement agencies in coordination with the Barangays', City's and Municipalities' local IATF shall take the lead in the implementation of these guidelines.
- **SECTION 5. PENALTIES.** Any violation of these guidelines shall constitute non-cooperation of the person or entities and is punishable under Section 9 (d) or (e), as the case may be, of Republic Act No. 11332, otherwise known as the Mandatory Reporting of Notifiable Diseases and Health Events of Public Health Concern Act, local ordinances, and other related laws.

**SECTION 6. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE.** If any part, section, or provision of these Guidelines is held invalid or unconstitutional, other provisions not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.

**SECTION 7. REPEALING CLAUSE.** Previous issuances or parts thereof in conflict with or inconsistent to the provisions of this Executive Order are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

**SECTION 8. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE.** This Executive Order shall take effect immediately.
