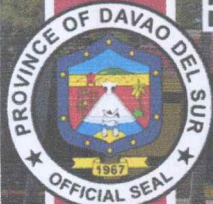

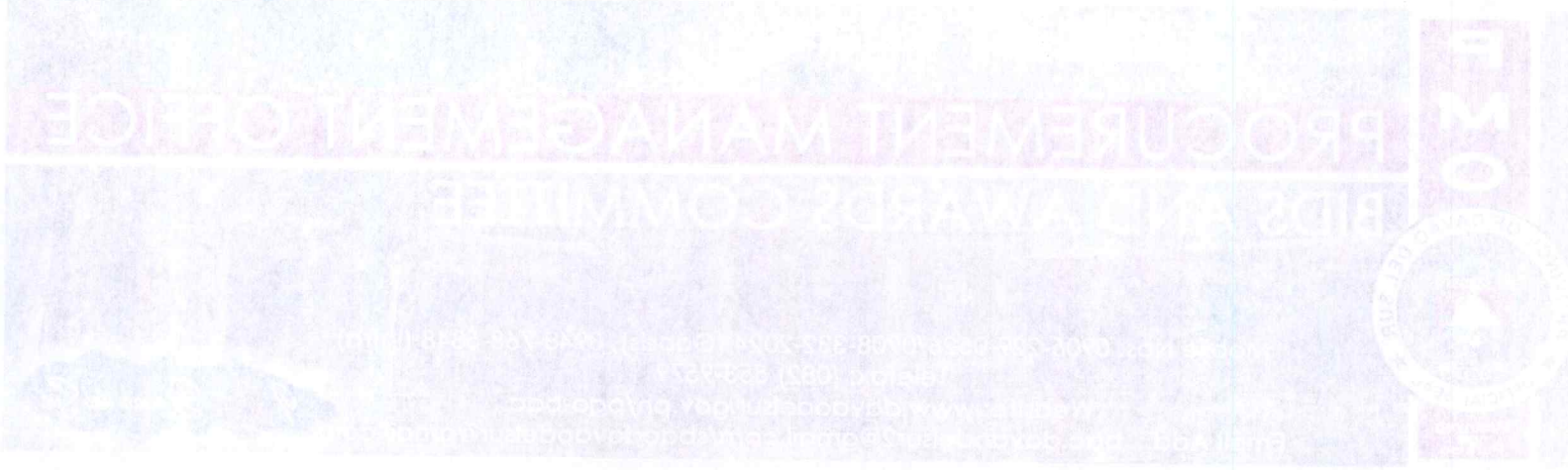

3. Bidding Requirements

The Bidding for the Project shall be governed by all the provisions of RA No. 9184 and its 2016 revised IRR, including its Generic Procurement Manuals and associated policies, rules and regulations as the primary source thereof, while the herein clauses shall serve as the secondary source thereof.

9. Classification and Amendment of Bidding Documents

Prospective bidders may request for clarification on and/or inspection of any part of the Bidding Documents. 11. Documents comprising the Bid: Financial Component

- 11.1. The second bid envelope shall contain the financial documents for the Bid as specified in Section VIII (Checklist of Technical and Financial Documents).
- 11.2. If the Bidder claims preference as a Domestic Bidder or Domestic Foreigner, certification issued by DTI shall be provided by the Bidder in a separate envelope as provided in the IB. Section 43.7.1 of the 2016 Revised IR of RA No. 9184.
- 11.3. Any bid exceeding the ABC indicated in paragraph 1 of the IB shall not be accepted.
- 11.4. For Foreign-funded procurement, a ceiling may be applied to bid prices provided the conditions are met under Section 41.2 of the 2016 Revised IR of RA No. 9184.
- 11.5. A multi-year framework agreement shall be submitted before the deadline of submission of bids as prescribed in the IB. For multi-year framework agreement, evaluation of the financial proposal during this stage is for purposes to determine bid eligibility and whether or not such financial proposal is within the ABC.

12. Bid Prices

- 12.1. Prices indicated on the Price Schedule shall be entered separately in the following manner:
